ROBOTICS TEAM DINNER

Velma Lomax, who heads Ventura's Robotics team, and two of her star participants, Kiernan Rickard and Nick de la Cruz, spoke to us about their experiences Wednesday at China Kitchen.

Kiernan and Nick are two of about 60 students from Ventura high schools who participate in the Lomax's Robotics class, which is part of the Ventura County Career Education Center. The class meets twice per week from 5:30 to 9 p.m. The team won two regional competitions this year, including one last month at Ventura College and the other at the University of California, Irvine.

Velma pointed out that Robotics students frequently continue their education in college studying STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) following their Robotics experience. Some are working engineers today. About half of the Robotics students either go to college or directly into manufacturing.

"This team has become my entire life," said Nick, a senior who is in his second year with the Robotics team. He's planning on attending Illinois Institute of Technology, which has offered him a \$35,000-per-year scholarship. He says the scholarship is "almost exclusively thanks to what I did in Robotics."

But the Robotics team provides much more than just hands-on experience in engineering.

"What Robotics does," said Velma, "is not just about robots. It creates friendships."

In addition to building the robots that have won the competition, the Robotics team also does outreach to schools and Boys and Girls Clubs in Ventura. Sunrise Optimist Club presented Velma and the boys with a check to help defray the cost of the program. They have fund-raised to the tune of \$70,000 this year.
